ANS Winter Meeting, Reno, Nevada, November 9-13, 2008

Thursday afternoon features Nuclear Engineering and Nuclear Science in Nevada, and you may also want to consider the panel on Nuclear Research and Education Developments in Nevada scheduled for Monday afternoon.

RPSD2008/ICRS-11 Topical Meeting Report

The RPSD biennial topical meeting was held at beautiful Callaway Gardens, Georgia, April 13-18, 2008. This was a joint meeting of the Radiation Protection and Shielding Division (RPSD2008) and the 11th International Conference on Radiation Shielding (ICRS-11). The technical program featured 325 papers in parallel oral technical sessions, tutorials, and poster sessions. Of the papers, 43% were from North America, 30% from Europe, and 27% from Asia. Many of the best papers are being repeated or updated at "The Best of RPSD2008" sessions at the ANS Winter Meeting in Reno, Nevada, November 9-13, 2008. Hands-on tutorial sessions included the tools of radiation protection and shielding: NJOY, SCALE, FLUKA, TRIPOLI, MCNP/X (repeated in Reno), Monte Carlo Burnup / Depletion, Monte Carlo electron transport, and Monte Carlo setup and visualization with MORITZ.

RPSD2010, Las Vegas, NV, April 19-23, 2010 - Rob Hayes, NSTec

Las Vegas will host the 2010 Radiation Protection and Shielding Division's topical meeting as a joint topical meeting with the Isotopes and Radiation Division (IRD) and the Biology and Medicine Division (BMD). Tours of the Nevada Test Site and Yucca Mountain are expected along with other venues including the Atomic Testing Museum. Of particular note is the outstanding technical content we have so long enjoyed from these topicals. If you have ever attended an RPSD topical, I am preaching to the choir. If you have not attended one of these your topicals, then you are in for a delicious surprise if you find yourself able to make the meeting. With the new addition of 2 sister divisions (IRD&BMD), the additional radiochemistry topics such as nuclear forensics and low level assay will be a welcome addition along with the other technical sessions expected to be added by this collaboration. Please plan on attending the 2010 topical to see the barrage of quality presentations on the truly cutting edge work in our field.

ANS 6 Standards Report Bill Hopkins, Standards Chair

1. John Wagner has asked to step down as chair of ANS 6.6.1 after successfully getting the reaffirmation of ANSI/ANS-6.6.1-1998, "Calculation and Measurement of Direct and Scattered Gamma Radiation from LWR Nuclear Power Plants." Please contact Bill Hopkins at <u>wchopkins@insightbb.com</u> if you would like to chair the next revision of this standard.

2. Based on feedback from the RPSD newsletter poll on resurrecting ANS-6.4.3, Gamma-Ray Attenuation Coefficients & Buildup Factors for Engineering" as an official ANSI standard, Jeff Ryman has agreed to chair a new working group for this. Dick Faw has

also agreed to join Jeff in this project. A new PINS form is in the works. Contact Jeff at rymanjc@excite.com or rymanjc@yahoo.com

3. F. Arzu Alpan's working group for ANS-6.1.2, "Neutron and Gamma-Ray Cross Sections for Nuclear Radiation Protection Calculations for Nuclear Power Plants" (revision of ANSI/ANS-6.1.2-1999) has voted to reaffirm this revision so that they may have more time to update the standard. This motion to reaffirm is now at the N17 level for review and approval.

4. Nolan Hertel is reviewing the logistics of a new revision and/or a temporary reinstatement of ANS-6.1.1-1991, "Dose Conversion Coefficients" and the possible separation of the standard into two separate standards. One on operational quantities --- ambient dose equivalent, personal dose equivalent, and directional dose equivalent. The second one would be for effective dose whose definition and radiation weighting factors were just changed in ICRP Publication 103.
